

Why Do Quilts Cost So Much?

Costs for materials, construction, & finishing for a 65" x 65" Throw Quilt.

Materials for throw quilt:

Fabric for the top:

6 yds @ \$11 yd = \$66 5 yds Backing @ \$13 = \$65

2 yds of Batting @ \$11 = \$22 5/8 yd for Binding @ \$11 = \$6.88

TOTAL Cost of Materials = \$159.88

Construction:

(Labor based on \$10/hr)

Making the top:

(Includes preparing the fabric, cutting the pieces, sewing the blocks, setting into rows, adding borders)

50 hours x \$10/hr = \$500

Assembling the Quilt Sandwich:

3 hours @ \$10/hr = \$30

Quilting on Domestic Machine:

(Charged by square inch in a simple all over design)

4225 si x \$.015 = \$63.38

Thread for Quilting - \$15

TOTAL Cost for Construction = \$768.26

Finishing:

Making the Binding: 2 hours x \$10 = \$20

Attaching the binding:

10 hours x \$10 - \$100

TOTAL Finishing costs = \$120

TOTAL COST OF QUILT = \$888.26

Note: A larger quilt, a more intricate pattern,a more elaborate quilting design will cause the price to increase.




MYSTERY QUILT

CLUE #2


From fabric A cut 2 strips at 2 inches.


From fabric C cut 4 strips at 2 inches.



Sew together 2 strips of fabric C and one strip of Fabric A. See diagram. Repeat with remaining strips. You now have two units like the diagram.

Sub cut at 2 inches. Need 36 units.






Dee's Brick Trick

a 16" block to piece (16 1/2" with seam allowance)

Use this simple pattern to create large blocks. Combine blocks as desired to create fun, colorful quilt tops perfect for charity quilts!

For one block cut the following:

- White: $4 4 \frac{1}{2}$ x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$
- Color 1: 1 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" & 1 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"
- Color 2: 1 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" & 1 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"
- Color 3: 1 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" & 1 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"
- Color 4: 1 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" & 1 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"

For two color blocks, use the same fabrics for:

- Color 1 & Color 4
- Color 2 & Color 3


ASK IF YOU NEED TO SUPPLY:

Bedding, towels, blow dryer, extension cords, large cutting mat, iron, or ironing board. If you'll be walking between buildings, don't forget umbrella, flashlight, and boots.

MORE RETREAT TIPS:

- Kits are great for retreats, everything is in one bag ready to go. Make sure you include the instructions.
- For extra special retreats, make signature blocks and have each attendee sign one. Put them together in a wallhanging for a memento.
- As a courtesy to other attendees, ask before you post any photos to social media. Someone may be working on a special project they don't want shared or they may be in their jammies (yes, all day!) and don't want their photo shared.
- \bullet Bring handwork for when you are tired of sewing at your machine.
