In this newsletter I have asked that a copy of our Bylaws be provided to everyone. Please take a moment to look them over. You will see in Article 9 – Amendment of By-Laws it states that any changes be submitted in writing to the Exec Board 10 days prior to being submitted to membership, and that a two-thirds vote of all attendees at the business meeting is required. This means that any member in good standing can suggest, IN WRITING, any change, amendment, correction etc. to the bylaws and then everyone will get a chance to discuss and vote on such change. Article 9 does not require a committee to review the bylaws, nor does it give any timeline for these bylaws to be reviewed. Look over the Bylaws and if you see anything that needs to be changed, updated, or otherwise amended, please provide that information in writing to the executive board and we will proceed with a vote at the following meeting.

I have signed up to do a quick discussion of "Piece by Piece, Block by Block" showing some of our most used blocks and what we call them.




Hope to see a lot of you at the meeting on February 19th.

January was a great start to the new year; 25 quilts were donated to Fostering Hope. They were so grateful to receive such beautiful quilts. Great job everyone!

"Homework"

- Cutters: Thanks to the volunteer cutters last month. WOW! Lots of homespuns and sports fabrics went home and we have <u>more</u> sports fabrics ready to cut this month too. We will have a bin to drop off any fabrics you've cut. Thanks so much for volunteering!
- Kits, kits and more kits are available to sew. Baby, Fostering Hope, pillowcases and bead bags are ready for the taking. Please drop any completed kits in the designated bag. Thanks!
- Quilts ready to be quilted: quilts are available for both longarmers and for domestic machines.

Machine Quilting Class: In March we're planning to demonstrate how easy machine quilting can be. We will teach you a few machine quilting tips and tricks, how to use your walking foot and change settings on your machine to make it easier. You bring your machine; we'll bring the quilts! If you'd like to take part, please see Margo to sign up.

Working With Homespuns: We will soon have kits ready from the homespun fabrics that were cut. Homespuns are a much looser weave than traditional cottons, extra care is needed when sewing them together. If you've never worked with homespuns before here are a few tips to help make the project go smoother.

- Use a smaller stitch length, like 1.5 and a slightly larger seam allowance, like a 3/8".
- Use your walking foot or dual feed foot.
- Use a leader strip of fabric. This helps the fabrics move smoother through the machine without being pulled under the presser foot.
- Homespuns stretch easily. Use lots of pins!
- Backstitch at the end of every row of blocks to keep the seams from opening when quilting.

Below are the fabric requirements and instructions for the afternoon class on February 19th, 2024.

"Pretty Petals" Table Runner

19 ½" X 43 ½"



Fabric Requirements:

3/4 YD of Background Fabric
1/4 YD of Colored Fabric for Petals
1/8 YD for Stems
1 /4 YD for Leaves
1 /8 Yd for Inner Border
1 /2 YD for Outer Boarder
1 /3 YD for Binding
1-1/2 YD for Backing
2" Thangles (Provided by instructor)
"Always From The Heart Quilt Designs"
12 Colorful Buttons

PRETTY PETALS TABLE RUNNER

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS and CLASS SUPPLIES

"Pretty Petals" is made with 12 – 6" Blocks comprised of background fabric, colorful petal fabric and 2 different greens for leaves and for stems. 2" Thangles were used to make the leaves (THANGLES WILL BE PROVIDED BY INSTRUCTOR) but can be made traditionally as well. This pattern can easily be adjusted to fit any table simply by adding or removing blocks. WOF: Width of Fabric HST: Half Square Triangles

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Leaf Units:

Cut $2 - 3 \frac{1}{4''} \times WOF$ strips of lighter green leaf fabric Cut $2 - 3 \frac{1}{4''} \times WOF$ strips of background fabric

Stem Units:

Cut 1 – 7/8" x WOF strip pf darker green stem fabric Cut 2 – 2" x WOF strips of background fabric Cut 2 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips of background, sub-cut into 24 – 2 ½ x 2 1/2; squares (meausurment is in inches)

*Petals: Use a single color fabric for flowers, or a variety of colors for flower Cut $4 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ &; x $2\frac{1}{2}$ (measurment are in inches); squares for of flower fabric (4 per flower / 48 total squares) Cut $49 - 1.2(8" \times 1.2(8" squares of background fabric$

Cut 48 – 1 3/8" x 1 3/8" squares of background fabric

Inner Border:

Cut 3 – 1" x WOF strips of inner border fabric

Outer Border: Cut 3 – 3 ½ (measuremnt is in inches); x WOF strips of outer border fabric

Binding:

Cut $5 - 2\frac{1}{4}$ (measurment is in inches); x WOF strips of binding fabric

*Note: Consider using different colors for each flower to give it a multi-color look!

Class Supplies:

Sewing machine with 1/4" foot with guide and open toe foot Thread to match or coordinate with fabrics (I used light grey thread) Seam Ripper Glass head pins Small Scissors Rotary Cutter and Mat Suggested rulers: 6 1/2 x 12 1/2; 6 1/2 x 6 1/2; 2 1/2; x 2 1/2; or small size square 2 inches Finished Thangles (Instructor will provide) <u>(ruler measurements are in inches)</u> Small iron with pressing mat if desired

I have received an email from Ms. Calder, Assistant Director at the Horry County Museum, she is looking for a few volunteers for her program in March. The following is a portion of her email. ..." Every March we do an annual Quilt themed month at the Museum. Every week we switch out QOV quilts in the hallways and have a ceremony on the Saturdays. But during the weekdays.

I try to have textile/quilt themed talks and featured quilters. I'm looking for some folks who might be interested in giving a talk or showing off quilts in a bed turning. It doesn't just have to be quilts, or showing them off. Over the years we've had some of the following to give you an idea:

Miniature Quilts Feedsack quilts Indigo workshops Embroidery Workshops Talks about dyeing Taking care of antique quilts Textile artists showing off the variety of things they do Felting The History of the American Sewing Machine

If you all have anyone in your guild who would be interested, we'd love to have them show off their work. It's pretty informal for the quilt turnings. We have a stage that we can set up on. It's usually about 30 min to an hour and the quilter talks about how they got started, shows off their work and if they have any special topics/techniques that they want to talk about. We've got a bed that we can lay them on and staff or a helper can hold them up as the person talks about them.

We give out door prizes at each of these and the speakers get a free membership to the Museum for doing the program. I'm also open to suggestions of anyone to reach out to! I'd like to start scheduling speakers in January so that we can fill up as many days as possible." 
