Coming up in June - The program for next month is a jelly roll race and sit n' sew. I'm sure at least some of us have jelly rolls just waiting to be used?? (Or you can actually cut your own jelly roll from your stash.) If you haven't done the race before, here is your chance; it's fun, fast and easy. All it takes is forty-two (42) - 2 1/2" strips by WOF and you can have an entire quilt made in a couple of hours or less!! This would also be a great way to make a quilt for charity. If you don't choose to participate in the race you can bring your own project to work on. Further instructions on the "1600 inch Jelly Roll Race" will be sent prior to next month's meeting.

Color Wheel Challenge Due in June -

Another reminder - If you've forgotten, here are the rules. The project is a table runner. Choose a main color for your project. Look at the color wheel to find the opposite color to your main color; this will be your secondary color. Don't be afraid to use shades or tints of your colors. For example, instead green and red, you might use mint and pink; or consider peach and baby blue, lemon and lavender or magenta and lime. Be creative. There are hundreds of color combination possible!! You can make your table runner any size you wish and use any technique, like pieced, appliqué, whole cloth or a combination of techniques. Lastly, you may also add a small amount of black, white or grey. \$\$\$ prizes will be awarded.

New Area Fabric Shop Opens -

A new fabric shop has opened, called "Sitn' Sew." Located in Conway, at 310 Laurel Street, they cater to crafters, garment makers and quilters. The fabric prices range from \$5.99 - \$6.99/yard. They also have a "sewing lounge" with 7 machines available for use by the public. A great place to go and sit and sew - thus the name! All they ask is a small donation to maintain the machines.
