To-Do List

- * Wear your name tag
- * Bring your own basic sewing kit - scissors, seam ripper, etc.
- * Bring supplies needed for the jobs listed below
- * Bring a smile and a can-do attitude!!
- * Bring your lunch
- * Bring Show and Tell

Projects to work on!

Fostering Hope boys quilts –

- 8 quilts to machine quilt. Bring walking foot or free-motion foot
- Sew borders and sashing to boys kits
- Sew homespun boys kits
- Make binding – Bring a mat, cutter and ruler
- Sew binding on by machine (we sew bindings by machine due to expected frequent washing and use)

Family Outreach of Horry County Baby Express quilts –

- 60 plus layered quilts to sew, topstitch and quilt. Bring walking foot and/or free-motion foot

MUSC Children's Hospital –

- Over 100 pillowcases to serge or sew. Need lots of irons and boards to press cuffs and completed pillowcases!
- Over 200 Beads of Courage bead bags to cord. CCQ supplies cording and bodkins. Bring scissors!

Lighthouse Care Center –

- Wheelchair quilts to sew, topstitch and quilt
- Walker bags to sew

As you can see from the list of charities we support that there is a lot to do. As a reward for all your hard work we will have an old fashioned ice cream social!! Ice cream sundaes for all the workers. YUM!!



Sewers need to bring:

- Sewing machine or serger. A walking foot is a **MUST** if using a sewing machine.
- Free-motion quilting foot
- Extension cord and/or multi-plug
- Neutral threads for general sewing
- Colored thread for topstitching and quilting
- Basic sewing supplies – pins, seam ripper, scissors, etc.

Pressers need to bring:

Ironing board and iron (we only have 1 board at the center) Last year we had 8 irons and boards and it was fantastic!

Cutters need to bring:

Mat, rotary cutter and ruler.
