March 18th Program - Mary Kerr will be visiting. Mary is an AQS Certified Appraiser, author, instructor, historian and curator of all things fun and quilty. Mary's lecture will be based on her book *Twisted*.

In the afternoon Mary will be available to appraise quilts. Written appraisals are necessary for insurance coverage of all quilted textiles. Written appraisals are \$75 each and verbal appraisals are \$25. This is a reasonable price because appraisals often cost a lot more. If you are interested in having a quilt appraised, please contact DJ Stultz to sign up. You will pay Mary directly but we need to know how many to expect.

On Tuesday, March 19, Mary will be teaching a class called Twist and Shout. This is a method that utilizes fragments of quilts or orphan blocks. Mary focuses on antique blocks but if you just want to learn the technique, you could showcase orphan blocks that need a home. If you want to use antique blocks but don't have any, Mary will have kits for sale that have everything you need. The class is \$40 and there are several openings. 
